

Join us as we continue our review of Quality throughout History with Quality in the Industrial Revolution.

The factory system, a product of the Industrial Revolution in Europe, began to divide craftsmen's trades into specialized tasks. This forced craftsmen to become factory workers and forced shop owners to become production supervisors, and marked an initial decline in employees' sense of empowerment and autonomy in the workplace.

Late in the 19th century the United States broke from European tradition and adopted a new management approach developed by Frederick W. Taylor, whose goal was to increase productivity without increasing the number of skilled craftsmen. He achieved this by assigning factory planning to specialized engineers and by using craftsmen and supervisors as inspectors and managers who executed the engineers' plans.

Taylor's approach led to remarkable rises in productivity, but the new emphasis on productivity had a negative effect on quality.

To remedy the quality decline, factory managers created inspection departments to keep defective products from reaching customers.
