Upcoming Education Opportunities!

The Rhode Island Section of the American Society for Quality is currently holding a **Certified Six Sigma Green Belt Course** at Taco Comfort Solutions in Cranston, RI.

This course is intended for those planning to sit for the Certified Six Sigma Green Belt Certification Exam. Six Sigma Green Belts are employees who spend some of their time on process improvement teams. They analyze and solve quality problems, and are involved with Six Sigma, lean, or other quality improvement projects.

The instructor for this course is Robert Imbruglio. Bob is a Lean Six Sigma Master Black Belt and has over 20 years' experience in Lean Six Sigma. For 10 of those years Bob was Chief of Continuous Improvement for General Dynamics Electric Boat Division.

RIASQ will also be hosting a **Certified Quality Engineer** refresher course beginning in September 2022. This course provides a thorough overview of the core competencies needed for the contemporary quality engineer including:

- Quantitative tools and techniques that drive continuous improvement
- Statistical data analysis and interpretation
- Design of products, processes, and services
- Product and process control techniques
- Quality management and leadership principles and techniques
- Development of the quality management system (QMS)

The instructor will be Caroline Bartlett, Certified Quality Engineer working as a Manager of Quality Engineering in the Medical Device Industry. She has 10 years experience working in Quality Engineering in various roles, including post market surveillance, design assurance, and quality control for large scale manufacturing.
